



Sand Point Country Club Dress Codes

❖ COUNTRY CLUB ATTIRE, MAIN DINING ROOM

Country Club attire is permitted throughout the Club and is required in the Main Dining Room.

Permitted:

- Tasteful and tailored slacks, khakis, skirts, or denim
- Collared shirts for men and boys
- Dress sandals are allowed for women and girls
- Jackets are encouraged but not required
- Tailored, finished hem shorts, no shorter than 5 inches from mid knee

Not Permitted:

- All forms of leisurewear, athletic attire, athletic shorts and hats

❖ SPECIAL EVENT ATTIRE

Consists of theme specific attire, as outlined in the promotional literature. At no time will Special Event Attire be less than Casual Attire.

❖ CASCADE GRILL ATTIRE

Attire appropriate to the Cascade Grill may be worn while in the Grill dining spaces and at the pool level.

Permitted:

- Neat, clean golf, athletic and tennis attire
- Tasteful shorts, skirts, or denim
- Neat, clean collared or collarless shirts
- Sandals and clean, soft spiked golf shoes
- Forward facing caps and visors are allowed in all areas except the Main Dining Room
- Children's sports jerseys

Not Permitted:

- Bare midriffs
- Swim suits without a cover-up (only permitted on the pool level)
- Sports cleats
- Bare feet

NOTE

In the event of an overage of members dining in the Cascade Grill, management will accommodate those members in the Main Dining Room. The dress code requirement will be waived at the discretion of the management in that instance.

❖ CASUAL ATTIRE

Casual attire is permitted throughout the Club with the exception of the Main Dining Room.

Permitted:

- Neat, clean golf, athletic and tennis attire
- Tasteful and tailored shorts, skirts, or denim



- Neat, clean collared or collarless shirts
- Sandals and clean, soft spiked golf shoes
- Forward facing caps and visors are allowed in all areas except the Main Dining Room

Not Permitted:

- Untailored sweatpants or sweat suits
- Tank tops, halter tops and bare midriffs
- Swim suits without a cover-up (only permitted on the pool level)
- Caps and visors are not permitted in the Main Dining Room
- Youth team sports uniforms

❖ **GOLF COURSE ATTIRE**

All attire for both men and women will be clean and in keeping with country club and golf standards. Golf attire may be worn throughout the Clubhouse. Soft spikes are the only kind permitted on the golf course and are also permitted throughout the Club.

- Shirts must be worn on the golf course at all times
- Men must wear their shirts tucked in
- The following garments should not be worn on the golf course:
 - Blue jeans of any type
 - Cutoffs or pants that are frayed
 - Warm-ups or sweat suits
 - Men's tee shirts, tank tops
 - Sport jerseys
 - Undergarment tops
 - Women's halter tops or strapless tops
 - Bare midriffs
 - Tennis jogging, gym or track shorts
 - Leggings or sport tights
- Sleeveless tops for women must have a collar
- Acceptable shorts for both men and women are tailored and must be no shorter than 5" from mid-knee.
- Hats and caps must be worn as designed, with the bill facing forward

❖ **SWIMMING ATTIRE**

Proper swim attire is required while using the pool. Swimwear should be tasteful and appropriate for a family club. Thong-style swimwear and uncovered underwear are not permitted, cutoffs and other sportswear not made for swimming are not to be worn in the pool. Children who are not toilet trained must be dressed in tight, well-fitting rubber or plastic pants. Disposable swim diapers are not allowed in either swimming pool. Swimming attire is not allowed in any of the clubhouse dining facilities other than the Snack Bar. Cover-ups and footwear must be worn to and from the upstairs locker rooms and anywhere outside of the pool level.



Sand Point Country Club House Rules and Policies

❖ CELL PHONE

The Club recognizes that cell phones are part of everyday life and in certain situations can allow members and their families to enjoy their Club with greater frequency and peace of mind if connected. As such, this policy provides for limited use of cell phones in specific areas of the Club and in a manner that is not disruptive to members and guests.

Cell phones must be in “silent” or “vibrate” mode while on Club property. Texting and emailing are allowed in all areas of the Club, but should be conducted in a way that does not impact other members’ club experience. Discretion and decorum are the overriding principles. Members are responsible for ensuring their guests adhere to the policy outlined below.

Golf Course, Pro Shop, Practice Areas and Driving Range

- Cell phone conversations are not permitted, except for a personal or medical emergency or contacting the Golf Shop to report an incident on the course or to request assistance relative to course play.

Clubhouse, Swimming Pool and Tennis Courts

- Cell phone conversations are *not* permitted in the Fitness Room, Locker Rooms or on the upper floor of the Club, which includes the Main Dining Room, Pan Room and upper level decks. If a call is to be made or taken while on the upper floor/deck of the clubhouse please utilize the phone room in the upper hall.
- Cell phone conversations are allowed in all other areas of the Clubhouse as well as on the swimming pool deck and tennis court viewing areas.

It is expected that members and guests will only make or take important calls and complete them quickly. The caller must be considerate of others, move away from the group, and speak in soft tones. Long conversations or loud conversations are not permitted as they have the potential to disturb others in proximity.

❖ SUPERVISION OF CHILDREN

SPCC is dedicated to providing family oriented programs and an environment where children are welcome to enjoy many club activities. With the diversity of the membership and having many club activities accommodating all types of members and guests it is important that members are responsible for their children’s behavior and understand the age limits on supervision or when a child should be accompanied by adults. ‘Accompanied’ is defined as within view of parents or guardians and in close enough proximity that the parents or guardians can monitor behavior at all times.

Clubhouse (Including Decks)

Children under the age of 10 on the Lobby Level/Cascade Grill Level must be accompanied and supervised by a parent or responsible person at least 16 years of age. Children under the age of 14 on the third floor/Main Dining Room must be accompanied and supervised by a parent or responsible person at least 16 years of age.

Golf Facilities (Course, Range, Putting Green, Short Game Practice Area)

Children under the age of 10 must be accompanied and supervised by a parent or responsible person at least 16 years of age when using the golf facilities. Children 10 years of age and over may enjoy unaccompanied access to all golf facilities provided that the junior golfer has passed the Golf Development Level 3 program and the Golf Professional has approved the application. The Golf Professional shall have full discretion and authority in approving junior golfers for golf facility access.



Pool Facilities (Main Pool, Wading Pool and Reception/Snack Bar Area)

Children under the age of 10 must be accompanied and supervised by a parent or responsible person at least 16 years of age when using the pool facilities. Children under the age of 10 will be permitted in the main pool provided they have passed the swim competency test.

Tennis Facilities

Children under the age of 10 must be accompanied and supervised by a parent or responsible person at least 16 years of age. Children 10 years of age and over may enjoy unaccompanied access to tennis facilities provided that the Tennis Professional approves the junior player. The Tennis Professional shall have full discretion and authority in approving junior players for access.

Fitness Center

Children under the age of 12 are not permitted. Children ages 12 and 13 are permitted in the Fitness Center only when accompanied and supervised by a parent or responsible guardian at least 16 years of age. Youth ages 14 to 21 may use the Fitness Center unaccompanied but are restricted to use between 9am and 9pm.

❖ FITNESS CENTER USE

The Fitness Center is available 24 hours/day to all membership types; however, there are no guest privileges in the Fitness Center. Use of the Fitness Center is restricted to members only.

- All users must register at the Front Desk and sign a waiver of liability before swipe card access is issued.
- For your own safety, please do not prop open doors or offer access to individuals who do not have individual access cards.
- Children under the age of 12 are not permitted. Children ages 12 and 13 are permitted in the Fitness Center only when accompanied and supervised by a parent or responsible guardian at least 16 years of age. Youth ages 14 to 21 may use the Fitness Center unaccompanied but are restricted to use between 9am and 9pm.
- Noise shall be kept to a minimum so as not to disturb others.
- Beverages in sealed containers are allowed; food is not permitted.
- Appropriate athletic attire and shoes are required. Swim attire is not acceptable.
- Pool lockers are intended for day use only. Please speak with the Front Desk if you're interested in renting a locker in one of the Main Locker Rooms.
- Use of the equipment is at your own risk. Please read instructions carefully prior to utilizing any of the equipment. Persons with known heart, asthmatic, hypertension, or other related health problems should not use this facility and its equipment without consulting a personal physician first.
- Please note any maintenance concerns or potentially hazardous conditions by contacting the General Manager.
- Personal music devices used in the Fitness Center shall be permitted only with the use of earphones.
- The Club does not provide Fitness Trainers, however, the Club does endorse Fitness Trainers who have been pre-screened by the Swim & Fitness Committee. No other personal trainers shall be authorized to provide services. The member hosting a Fitness Trainer must accompany them at all times while on the premises and sign them in upon arrival.
- Fitness Trainers cannot train more than four members at any given time and may not establish routine class schedules without prior authorization from the General Manager/COO.



❖ **MEMBER AND GUEST CONDUCT**

Complaints

Members shall not complain of Club events, scheduling, rules, bylaws, other members, or any employee of the Club. Members having complaints shall limit such complaints to discreet and confidential communications to the General Manager/COO.

Complaints Regarding Members

Complaints of misconduct on the part of a member and/or guest shall be reported to the General Manager/COO or Club President, who shall submit the matter to the Board of Trustees for such action as it deems appropriate. It is recommended that complaints concerning such members be in writing. Members shall not reprimand fellow members.

❖ **HOUSEGUEST POLICY**

Members who have invited a houseguest, may, by submitting a letter to the General Manager/COO, have a house guest(s) use their membership.

- Houseguests must be staying in the same home with the sponsoring member and must have no other residence within King, Pierce, Snohomish, Skagit, or Thurston counties.
- Houseguests are treated as members for their stay, without being accompanied by the member or being limited to the frequency limitations restricting other guests.
- A member may use the houseguest privileges for a maximum of two weeks (14 days) per year in the aggregate.
- All membership categories are eligible for this privilege. Houseguest privileges are equal to those of the host member.
- Houseguests may use the respective club amenities for their accompanying fees.
- All use fees and charges are billed to the host's member account.
- Houseguests may use the golf course under the appropriate membership category and will pay the prevailing accompanied guest rate.
- The General Manager/COO may revoke the use of facilities of a member's houseguest(s) at any time, without notice or cause.

❖ **ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE SERVICE**

The Board of Trustees has established a policy in compliance with Washington State Liquor Control Board regulations. These regulations prohibit serving individuals under the age of 21 and those who are intoxicated or who show signs of intoxication. All members of Sand Point Country Club are expected to assume responsibility for recognizing the symptoms of excessive alcohol consumption by themselves and by their guests. Employees of Sand Point Country Club have been trained to recognize the signs of intoxication and determine whether an individual must be denied further service of alcoholic beverages because of the possibility of intoxication. The manager on duty is responsible for determining whether or not to cease serving alcohol. Members shall not abuse or reprimand staff in the execution of their duty if the decision is to cease service of alcohol to an individual. Any disciplinary action necessary because of violation of the Club's policy of alcohol consumption shall be referred to the Board of Trustees.

❖ **POLICY ON SEXUAL AND OTHER IMPERMISSIBLE FORMS OF HARASSMENT**

Sexual harassment has serious consequences. It is prohibited for any officer, member, manager, supervisor, employee or guest to create a hostile work environment or otherwise make unwelcome sexual advances, requests for sexual favors, or any other verbal or physical conduct of a sexual nature when:

- Submission to such conduct is made either explicitly or implicitly a term or condition of employment.



- Submission to, or rejection of, such conduct unreasonable interfering with an individual’s work performance or creating an intimidating, hostile or offensive work environment. SPCC is committed to providing a work environment that is free of discrimination. Actions, words, jokes or comments based on an individual’s sex, race, ethnicity, age, religion or any other legally protected characteristic will not be tolerated. Any individual who has reason to believe that he or she is the victim of impermissible harassment should promptly report the facts of the incident to the General Manager/COO who will investigate the circumstances in which the incident or incidents allegedly occurred. If you are not comfortable discussing the matter with the General Manager/COO, you should contact any manager or trustee with whom you are more comfortable. Once your complaint has been reviewed, immediate corrective action will be taken. Anyone engaging in harassment of any type will be subject to disciplinary action, including possible discharge.

❖ **MEMBERSHIP INFORMATION**

Members are required to keep all membership information current with the Club, including address, phone number(s), email address, and family status. Including births, deaths, divorce, or new marriages. Any member who wishes to make a change in family status must notify the Club in writing. Family status changes may only be made once per 365 days.

Termination of Membership

Any Social, Swim & Tennis, or Clubhouse Social member who wishes to terminate their membership must do so by submitting a written request to the Club, at least 30 days prior to the next billing statement date.

Social, Swim & Tennis Waitlist

If a Clubhouse Social (Social, Swim & Tennis waitlist) member reaches the top of the entry list and elects not to transfer into the category, the member will either be removed from the waitlist and remain a Clubhouse Social member, or the waitlisted member will be required to pay an additional \$1,000.00 Initiation Fee installment toward the full Initiation Fee.

Food Minimum Requirement

All members are required to spend \$180.00 per quarter on food services at the Club (\$90.00 per quarter for unmarried members with no children). Unless this amount is spent on Club food services (service charge and tax not included) during each member’s quarter, the full sum or unspent balance will be added to the member’s statement at the end of their quarter. Food minimums may be deferred to the following quarter (extended absence from the area, one time only per year), upon written application to the Member Billing representative or General Manager/COO.

❖ **MISCELLANEOUS CLUB POLICIES**

Heelies, Scooters, and Skateboards Prohibited

To protect the safety of club members, guests, and employees, the use of ‘heelies,’ scooters, and skateboards are prohibited on club property including Hoetmer Drive.



Personal Alcohol

Consumption of personal alcoholic beverages is prohibited during the hours bar service is available. Wine may be brought to a member dining function and is subject to a corkage fee.

Cancellation Policy

There is a 48-hour cancellation policy in effect for all member special events. There is no cancellation policy for regular dining. Cancellations made within the 48-hour window will be billed to the member's account. All changes to reservations can be made through the Front Desk and after hours at extension 200.

Golf Clubs

Golf clubs are not permitted inside the Clubhouse. Areas for dropping and transporting clubs from parking lots and entries are provided in outside areas. The Pro Shop has storage facilities available. Members and guests are requested not to carry bags into the Clubhouse.

Service Charge

Charges for food and beverages include an 18% service charge. Member sponsored parties and all December parties are subject to a 20% service charge for both food and beverage.

Guests

Guests who belong to another private golf club may have reciprocal billing privileges at SPCC and may sign chits for club services.

Clubhouse Closure

The Clubhouse is customarily closed for deep cleaning and training activities during the first two weeks of January each year.

Parking

Members and guests may park in designated areas only. Areas reserved for Club operations, deliveries, handicapped, etc. are clearly posted and members and guests may not park in those areas. Cars improperly parked will be impounded.

Pets

Dogs and other pets are not allowed on the Club premises at any time, with the exception of documented service animals.

Smoking

Smoking is prohibited within the Clubhouse and within 25ft of doors, windows, and air intake units. Please dispose of smoking material properly.

Unauthorized Posting Prohibited

The posting of any paper, notice, or solicitation on Club premises without advance permission of the General Manager/COO is prohibited.



Sand Point Country Club Golf Rules and Policies

❖ HOLE IN ONE POLICY

When a Hole in one occurs...

- Any golf member (male or female) who is at the Club may obtain a ticket in the golf shop. Once golf shop is closed, no more tickets will be distributed. Ticket is only valid the day of the hole in one.
- Ticket is submitted to the bar for a drink.
- Each golf membership, including Senior and Intermediate, is charged \$5.00.
- The total cost of the drinks is subtracted from the total billed and the balance goes into a large pot. At season's end (date of Men's Trophy Night), the pot will then be divided between the men's and women's division by percentage of hole in ones made by the men and women.

❖ PACE OF PLAY POLICY

Sand Point's pace of play for a golf foursome should be less than 4 hours and 3 minutes. Irrespective of the size of your group, it is always your group's responsibility to keep up with the group in front of you. If your group is unable to keep up with the group ahead and there is a group waiting behind you, it is necessary to invite that group to play through. It is then your responsibility to maintain pace with that group. It is not reasonable for any group to expect to play through the field if there are no gaps ahead. Furthermore, it is not reasonable for any group that falls out of position not to invite the group behind to play through.

Sand Point prefers groups of four (4) or less. Groups larger than 4 are discouraged, but may be allowed if the situation makes sense and has been approved by one of the golf professionals. The fivesome should be warned that if they impede the play of faster groups behind them, they will be asked to divide their group into two (2) separate groups to maintain their pace of play. During busy periods when there are groups of players waiting to tee off, the golf professionals will make their best efforts to allocate players into groups of four and will discourage groups larger than four (4).

❖ LOSS OF OR DAMAGE BY ERRANT GOLF BALLS TO PROPERTY OF OTHERS

A member shall be responsible for all damage or injury to property of another (including The Club), caused by or resulting from a golf ball hit by the member, any of his family members or guests. Property of others shall include property belonging to an owner of any residential property adjacent to or in close proximity to the Club's golf course and to an owner of any vehicle or mobile equipment in or about any of the parking areas or roadways within, adjacent to or in close proximity to the Club's golf course. For purposes of this provision, the responsibility of the member shall be without regard to whether the owner of any such residence property or owner of any such vehicle is a member of the Club. When a member hits an errant golf ball and becomes aware that it has or may have caused damage or injury as stated in this paragraph, it shall be such member's duty to promptly contact and notify the owner of the property of the damage or injury, identify such member or guest as the individual responsible and reasonably compensate the owner for its loss, including the cost of repair or replacement.

Nothing in this paragraph shall be interpreted or construed as a Club policy or House Rule with regard to the matter of personal injury or death caused by an errant golf ball, it being the Club's intention that such an occurrence, the loss or damages there from and any responsibility with respect thereto shall be a civil matter as between the persons involved and shall be determined or resolved in accordance with the laws of the State of Washington.

❖ OUTSIDE EVENT POLICY STATEMENT

Regarding Outside Events on the Course, Sand Point Country Club's Head Golf Professional and General Manager/COO may approve up to 6 outside golf events to be played on Mondays throughout the calendar



year. Additional events may be added upon request by the General Manager/COO or Head Golf Professional. Additional events must be approved in advance by the Golf Committee. When possible, outside events will be scheduled during the shoulder season.

Groups or organizations asking to use the course will be fully vetted by the Head Golf Professional and the Club Manager/COO in order to select users that will respect Sand Point Country Club values and standards. Events are to be priced by the pro shop to meet budgeted revenue targets and costs. The Club may approve organizations that are either non-profit or for profit. Preference will be given to non-profit organizations, but non-profit status shall not be a requirement.

This policy shall be reviewed annually by the Golf Committee and Board of Trustees to assure that policy objectives are being met.

❖ **HIGH SCHOOL AND COLLEGE TEAMS POLICY**

Sand Point Country Club gets many requests from schools and colleges asking for playing privileges on our golf course. We are proud to set aside days and times in spring and fall for schools and colleges to play our course. Unfortunately we cannot honor all requests each year. As a result, all schools and colleges must submit their request no later than January 31st to craig@sandpointcc.com. Applications filed after this date will not be eligible. The Golf Committee will in turn consider the application on an annual basis. Craig Hunter will notify you within 30 days on the status of your request. If your request is approved, play days and times are to be arranged with Craig Hunter for that year.

- Dress Code: Collared shirts must be worn on the golf course at all times. Men must wear their shirts tucked in. The following garments may not be worn on the golf course: blue jeans of any type; cutoffs or pants that are frayed; warm ups or sweat suits; men's tee shirts, tank tops; undergarment tops; women's halter tops or strapless tops; bare midriffs; tennis jogging, gym or track shorts; leggings or sport tights. Acceptable shorts for both men and women are tailored and must be no shorter than 5" from mid-knee. Hat and caps must be worn as designed, with the bill facing forward.
- Play times: To be arranged between the team coach and Craig Hunter before the season for that calendar year.
- Cell phones: Only permitted in the parking lot and not allowed on the golf course.
- Parking: On the upper parking lot only and not down by the Clubhouse.
- Work Days: Each school will work 2 days each calendar year.
- Members will always have priority on the 1st tee.
- You are not permitted in the Clubhouse Snack station at the turn.

❖ **MATCH PLAY POLICY**

Each match shall have a stated deadline for completion as determined the by Pro Shop and/or Golf Committee.

- It is the responsibility of both teams to contact each other to establish a time and play the match within the specified time frame.
- It is the responsibility for all competitors to be available to play during the specified time frame. Competitors should give careful consideration of their ability to be available to play before signing up for the competition.
- In the case of extended course closures, a new deadline may be established, as determined by the Pro Shop and/or Golf Committee that will apply to all un-played matches. Matches are to be played in marginal weather; it is part of the game. The Pro Shop will not honor requests for deadline extensions, for any other reason.

- If the match has not been played and neither team shows up by the deadline, then both teams will forfeit.
- If the match has not been played by the deadline and one team (or team member) shows up at the deadline, that team will be declared the winner of the match. For the Winter Chapman, the deadline is 12pm. For all Individual and Best Ball matches, the deadline is 5pm.
- All matches must be played when competitors are present. There shall be no match played by “matching cards”, flipping coins or in any format other than the tournament format.
 - Best Ball Matches - Use full handicap, play off the low handicap
 - Chapman Matches – 40% of high, 60% low combined. Play off the low handicap
 - Individual Matches - Play off the low handicap

❖ GOLF COURSE ETIQUETTE

Care For Your Course

Each member shall diligently assist in keeping the course in good condition; we'd like to offer some tips for proper course etiquette and care. By making these simple rules an everyday part of your game, you'll be properly caring for the course you love and making the game more enjoyable for those playing behind you.

Bunkers – Leave it the way you found it!

- Always enter and exit a bunker from the low side. This minimizes damage to our steep bunker faces.
- Before leaving a bunker, players should use a rake to smooth over and fill up all footprints and holes made by them and any nearby made by others.
- When finished, the head of the rake should be placed in the bottom of the bunker with the end of the handle resting on the bunker edge.
- After you rake the bunker, imagine your ball there and ask yourself if you'd be happy with the lie?

In a quest to improve upon bunker playability, consistency, and most importantly, golfer satisfaction, we have adopted a new style of maintenance raking called the “Aussie Method.” With The Aussie Method style of raking, only the bottom portion of each bunker is fan raked with a steel tined leaf rake and the bunker faces and edges are smoothed with the rounded, back side portion, of the on course bunker rakes. By using the back of the course rakes, teeth up, to smooth the faces, the sand on our steep faces has firmed up. Golfers can do their part and refrain from disturbing the smooth sides of the bunker when raking. Only raking the bottom portion of the bunker where it is fan raked by the maintenance team would be of great help. And remember, bunkers are defined in The Rules of Golf as a, “Hazard.” Anyone that never hits into a bunker can disregard the content of this article.

Greens – Love your greens!

- Players should not lean on their clubs when on the putting green, particularly when removing the ball from the hole. This can leave a depression on the putting surface.
- Never let the flag-stick drop heavily onto the green surface. Set it down easily, to avoid potential indentations.
- Repair your ball mark and any other you see on the greens
- Never remove the ball from the cup using the head of your putter. This can damage the edge of the hole and spoil it for others.

Tees – Love your greens!

- Replace your divot or fill it with the sand and seed mixture. This includes practice swing divots.



- Pick up your tee following your shot. Broken tees can be discarded into the broken tee caddies located off to the side of the tee markers.
- Keep from taking your pull cart across the teeing surface.

❖ **CONTROL BY GOLF PROFESSIONAL**

Play on the course is under the control and supervision of the Head Golf Professional and his assistants. Throughout the year, hours of play may be adjusted by the Golf Professional and Golf Course Superintendent in response to weather, course conditions, tournaments, or other events that significantly impact the golf course or conditions for play. All members and guests shall comply with the requests and suggestions of the Golf Professional and his assistants for speeding and facilitating play on the course. A match will not start on the second nine unless it has permission of the Golf Professional or his assistants. Eighteen-hole matches starting on the back nine will alternate on the First Tee with groups waiting to tee off. For example, if a match starting on the back nine is on the First Tee prior to another match about to start, the match which has already played the back nine has the right of way. If a match starting on the first hole is on the First Tee when a match starting on the back nine completes the eighteenth hole, the match starting on the first hole has the right of way. Thereafter, matches completing the back nine first and matches starting on the first hole shall alternate.

Foursomes

The standard number of players in a group shall be four, except that the Golf Professional or assistants have the discretion to allow larger or smaller groups.

Hours of Play Adult Golf Hours:

Rules governing hours of play are set by the Board of Trustees to maximize members' enjoyment of the course. The Board may change these rules at any time.

1. All members and spouses with playing privileges may play the golf course at any time it is open except on a day of a tournament recognized and approved by the Golf Committee.
2. When guests are allowed, they may be brought irrespective of gender.
3. Tee times shall not be assigned in advance.

Metal Spike Prohibition

Metal spikes are prohibited at SPCC.

❖ **SPEED/PUSH CARTS**

The majority of the membership walks; to help encourage walking we offer pushcarts for your use. When using pushcarts it is important to use them properly. Do not push them across tees or greens and do not push them between the greens and greenside bunkers. When around the green, get used to pushing your clubs toward the next tee, while you take the clubs you need for your short game.

Push Carts/Joey's

- Keep pushcarts/joey's off of the aprons and greens, and do not push them between greenside bunkers and green
- Keep pushcarts/joey's off the teeing grounds

Electric Carts

- Keep them to the path on all par 3s
- Never drive them closer than 30 yards to the green
- Follow the cart signage on the holes that tell you when to exit the fairway



❖ **CHILDREN ON THE COURSE**

Children under the age of 10 are permitted to play golf on the course only if accompanied by a parent or other responsible adult. Exceptions to this rule may be made at the discretion of the Golf Professional. Parents should schedule play at such times that it will not interfere with regular play. Check with the Pro Shop for suitable times.

A non-golfing child may accompany a parent or other adult on the course. The safety and conduct of the child is the sole responsibility of the supervising adult. The golf course is not to be used as a "playground," rather as a place for children to learn about the game. All club rules and policies regarding speed of play, etiquette, dress, and use of golf carts must be followed.

❖ **CELL PHONE USE ON COURSE**

Cell phone conversations are not permitted in the following areas: Golf Course, Pro Shop, Practice Areas and Driving Range, except in the case of a personal or medical emergency or contacting the Golf Shop to report an incident on the course or to request assistance relative to course play.
